Building Hospitality

Our building is a wonderful resource. It can also feel like a labyrinth when you are learning your way around. A few key locations that may be helpful to you:

Accessible restrooms — located behind the Sanctuary; use the southwest door (to the left of the Chancel) **All gender restrooms** — located beneath the Sanctuary; use the stairs from the Narthex (main entrance)

Elevator — located just beyond the southwest door (to the left of the Chancel)

Nursery & extended care — located on the first floor of the Education Building; use the southwest door and the elevator, following directional signs

Hearing-assist devices — located at the southwest door, or ask an usher to provide you with one Ushers are always willing to assist you in finding your way or answering other questions.

TODAY'S LITURGY — The Prayer of Confession was written by Rev. Jenny McDevitt. The Affirmation of Faith comes from the Nicene Creed.

TODAY'S COVER ART features *The Transfiguration* by Raphael. Raphael depicts a very high Christology in this piece, through both the story chosen and the composition. Jesus is suspended in midair. The light is brighter around his body, while the humans are lower and in darker light. Overall, Jesus' divinity is on clear display.
