Scripture Lesson

John 2:1-11

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bride-groom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

This is the Word of God for the people of God. **Thanks be to God.**

TODAY'S COVER IMAGE — While there are countless images of the wedding at Cana, this Greek icon is unique in that it shows the water changing from water into wine. Look closely at the water being poured from the jar. Blue slowly fades into red as water turns to wine. The time in which the water changes is never specified in the story. Scholars have speculated various opinions — that the water changed immediately or that it changed when it was served. We don't know about timing, but we do know about transformation. It happens, on God's own time.
