

Luke 6:27-38

Jesus said, "But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. Do to others as you would have them do to you. "If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. If you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. If you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, to receive as much again. and the path is fraught with challenge.


But resurrection will come


TODAY'S COVER IMAGE — This week's cover art is a creation of Theodore Hill. Hill worked for many years as a custodian for the City of Atlanta's Department of Sanitation and spent his off-hours as a caddy at the golf course of a local country club. A man of strong religious convictions, his pieces usually focus on the life of Christ. They combine painted cardboard with a variety of materials ranging from rocks, broken glass and mirror, marbles, fabric scraps, and discarded bits of metal and wood, to pecans and peanuts. Some of these materials were sourced from his previous employment. Hill's work came to the attention of the public in 1986, when he submitted to a juried exhibition of art by Atlanta city employees. He finished third in the "amateur" category.
