# **Building Hospitality**

Our building is a wonderful resource. It can also feel like a labyrinth when you are learning your way around. A few key locations that may be helpful to you:

**Accessible restrooms** — located behind the Sanctuary; use the southwest door (to the left of the Chancel) **All gender restrooms** — located beneath the Sanctuary; use the stairs from the Narthex (main entrance)

**Elevator** — located just beyond the southwest door (to the left of the Chancel)

**Nursery & extended care** — located on the first floor of the Education Building; use the southwest door and the elevator, following directional signs

**Hearing-assist devices** — located at the southwest door, or ask an usher to provide you with one Ushers are always willing to assist you in finding your way or answering other questions.

Here, instead, if one looks only briefly or casually, it is possible to miss the signs of his identity. Similarly, while some of the temptations we face are significant and obvious, others are smaller and more insidious.


