

TODAY'S LITURGY — The responsive morning prayer was written by Rev. Tom Are, Jr. of Village Presbyterian Church in Prairie Village, Kansas. The affirmation was written by Rev. Peter K. Perry of First United Methodist Church in Olympia, Washington.

TODAY'S COVER ART — *Resurrection* is a watercolor etching by Paul Van Dongen. Van Dongen says: 'Nature with its cycle of growing, flowering, dying and sprouting out again is symbolic to me of Christ and his resurrection. Marleen Hengelaar-Rookmaaker writes: At first glance that also seems to be the theme of the work depicted here. [After] a closer look at all the elements that together make up this etching, we discover that this print deals with even more. First of all, we see a straight thorn branch with some shoots in the middle and at the top. Then we see the crown of thorns, cut in two by the straight branch. Purple is the color of sin and suffering. White is the color of Jesus glorified. Blue points to heaven. The yellow and green of the leaves suggest new life.
