

Building Hospitality

Our building is a wonderful resource. It can also feel like a labyrinth when you are learning your way around. A few key locations that may be helpful to you:

Accessible restrooms — located behind the Sanctuary; use the southwest door (to the left of the Chancel) All gender restrooms — located beneath the Sanctuary; use the stairs from the Narthex (main entrance) Elevator — located just beyond the southwest door (to the left of the Chancel)

Nursery & extended care — located on the first floor of the Education Building; use the southwest door and the elevator, following directional signs

Hearing-assist devices — located at the southwest door, or ask an usher to provide you with one Ushers are always willing to assist you in finding your way or answering other questions.

Welcoming Children

Just as Jesus welcomes the little children to come, so we welcome children of all ages in our worship services. We are better when all members of our family are here! In order to make the worship service as welcoming for our littlest ones as possible, we provide engaging worship bags and a Word with Children every time we gather. After the Word with Children, kindergarten-aged children and younger may leave for extended care in Davis Hall or stay for the remainder of worship. The first time your child attends extended care, please accompany them to sign them in (then feel free to return to the Sanctuary). It is always a joy to have your children and all the wiggles, giggles, questions, noises, and insights they bring. Scripture Lesson

Matthew 28:1-10

After the Sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And suddenly there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning and his clothing white as snow. For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you." We believe in God, who is light in the darkness, who never gives up on love, who is always working for our good, who weeps when we weep and laughs when we laugh, who calls us to be more than we are

and transforms our tears into alleluias.

	 We believe in Christ, present at the time of creation, heard in the words of the prophets, alive in the lessons taught to disciples. We believe in Christ risen, not stuck in a tomb of despair, nailed to a cross, or buried in the past, but alive forever and with us always. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the invisible, ongoing presence of God, the joy, hope, and peace of endless possibility unfolding around us all the time. We believe the Spirit calls us to community, to compassion, to welcome, and to acts of mercy and justice. God cannot be contained: not by books or institutions, not by fear or hate, and certainly not by a tomb.

WEEKEND BACKPACK FOOD PROGRAM — During April, we are collecting shelf-stable milk (8 oz) and peanut butter.


