CREATION CARE NOW — For the church, water is a sacred gift, and our stewardship of it has profound spiritual, as well as physical consequences. The United Methodist Church writes: "Water is an integral part of God's radical expression of God's love for all humanity. Water cannot be monopolized or privatized. It is to be shared like air, light, and earth." (Book of Resolutions, 2016.) The PCUSA has issued this statement, "Humans are making excessive demands upon, and doing reckless damage to, the lakes and streams, the ground water, and even to the oceans. Meanwhile, most third-world nations cannot afford the systems that would provide safe drinking water." One thing you can do now is goin online and find out about *Living Waters for the World*, an initiative of the Synod of Living Waters that provides clean water systems in Central America and beyond; consider donating it or to a local group dedicated to the health and accessibility of our waters.
