

Dear Friends,

This Lent, we're exploring the "I Am" statements Jesus makes throughout the Gospel of John. I have to confess that John is one of my favorite books in all of scripture, and I was able to spend extra time studying this gospel in particular with specialists in the field in my final year of seminary. By looking at the seven "I Am" statements, we won't cover the whole scope of the gospel. (Not even close, honestly.) But we will hear Jesus talk very specifically about himself, using a variety of metaphors that would have been commonly understood during his lifetime.

How many of those "I Am" statements can you remember? Try to recall some of them before reading further ... or just keep reading! Jesus says, at various times throughout John:

- "I am the Bread of Life"
- "I am the Light of the World"
- "I am the Good Shepherd"
- "I am the Gate"
- "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life"
- "I am the Resurrection and the Life"
- "I am the Vine"

As we read and reflect together on each of these, we'll learn more about why those associations made immediate sense to those who heard Jesus speak.


It makes me curious, though. If Jesus were crafting these metaphors today, what might he say? "I am the Internet Search Engine"? "I am the Grits of Life"? "I am the Mackinac Bridge"? This might sound tongue-in-cheek, but my question is genuine. Thinking through some of the most important characteristics of the one we call Jesus Christ, what modern-day metaphors could help others better understand who he is and all that he promises?

Send me your ideas (and how you came to those ideas, if you're willing!). Fair warning ... they might show up in an upcoming sermon!

According to John's Gospel, Jesus says "I Am" seven times. I am the light of the world, he says. I am the bread of life. I am the good shepherd. I am the gate. I am the vine. I am the resurrection and the life. I am the way and the truth and the life. Those metaphors don't exist on their own, however. Jesus uses the exact same phrasing that God used when speaking with Moses at the burning bush. In so doing, Jesus makes an unmistakable statement about who he is. And not only do those seven statements tell us who he is, they tell us what he promises to those who follow him. Journey through the Gospel of John with us this Lent.

Early Church

During Lent, we will have a second Sunday morning worship service. Simply called Early Church, this service will meet from 8:30-9:10 am in the Sanctuary. We will worship in that beautiful, familiar, sacred space, but the service will have a distinctively different feel. We'll gather around tables set up throughout the Sower's Chapel and the front of the Nave. Coffee and pastries will be available and welcome at your tables. The liturgy will be similar to the 10:30 service, but somewhat abbreviated. Instead of a full-length sermon, a 5 minute introduction to the text will be offered, followed by conversation around the tables, guided by discussion questions -- because you all bring insights to scripture, as well. Prayers will include specific requests you share with us. We'll have the same preacher as the 10:30 am service, another pastoral staff member as liturgist, Matt McCall leading music, and a choral scholar helping us sing. Childcare will be available.

The first Sunday of Lent is February 18. So, Early Church will meet February 18 and 25, and March 3, 10, 17, and 24. Your staff and Session are excited about this. We will learn a lot as we go. The response to Breakfast Church was overwhelmingly positive -- and not just because Flying Biscuit provided the food! The opportunity to discuss scripture together in the context of worship really impacted some of you. We want to give that another try during this Lenten season. Think of it as a congregational Lenten practice.

If you are a tried-and-true 10:30-er, don't worry: all signs of Early Church will be tucked away by 10 am. Our "regular" service will continue as always. Thank you for being a congregation that is willing to try something new. You never quite know where the Spirit will lead us next!

Circle of Welcome

In early February, Shandon will open our arms and hearts to welcome our third refugee family to Columbia. Our group of volunteers, called the Circle of Welcome, partners with Lutheran Services to meet the family's needs as they resettle in our community.

Shandon's Circle of Welcome will greet the family at the airport and take them to their temporary home, a home we will stock with their first groceries and serve a culturally appropriate first meal. The Circle of Welcome volunteers will provide transportation to places such as the grocery store, medical appointments, social security office, schools, job training, and interviews. Volunteers may attend English classes with the family members or provide English language tutoring. Once their permanent home is finalized, the group will secure necessary household items and furniture and help the family move to their new home. As we become aware of their needs, we will reach out to the congregation for donations. Volunteers will also plan outings with the family to introduce them to American culture and life in Columbia. As the family settles into their new life in the United States, the Circle of Welcome will be their first American friends.

The members of Shandon's Circle of Welcome are a diverse group of church members. We span a number of different decades in our ages. We are single and married folks. We are empty-nesters and have young children. We are retired individuals, stay-at-home parents, medical personnel, educators, social workers, state workers, attorneys, and clergy.

Pray that we will bond as a group as we minister, remaining culturally sensitive as we support this refugee family. Pray especially for the family as they begin their new life in Columbia. Let's Go Green, Shandon!

Scripture says, "Keep watch over yourselves and all the flock of which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers. Be shepherds of the church of God, which he bought with his own blood" (Acts 20:28). Have you ever wondered what God defines as a "flock?" Did he mean our family, community members, those who are vulnerable? Who, or what, are we actually overseeing? God may have in mind a multitude of meanings for the word "flock." There's one idea Outreach would like you to consider further - keeping watch over the Earth. Shandon is a certified "Earth Care Congregation," which means that we take an active role in caring for God's earth in four categories: worship, education, facilities, and outreach. We realize our efforts to restore and preserve creation are ongoing tasks that require constant attention and commitment. Part of our mission is to provide church and community members with education about how to become more sustainable in your everyday life. An easy way to do this is to reduce your amount of plastic waste. What if you used a canvas tote bag made from recycled material to carry your groceries? Session Update

- At the December stated Session meeting, Church Administrator Robert Walker reported that dead limbs had been removed from the big tree in the memorial garden and damage to the roof caused by falling limbs repaired.
- Rev. John Cook reported that Shandon will be giving \$5,000 to Habitat for Humanity from the Galloway Community Endowment for a Faith Build in Spring 2024. He also reported a significant gift to Qwest West from alumnus and pastor Sam Schauss, who also provided an Advent devotional shared on the church's website.
- At the January stated Session meeting, Session approved several items of business, including: a motion to call the annual congregational meeting on Sunday, February 11, 2024; a motion to serve communion at the Presbyterian Women of Trinity Presbytery meeting at Shandon Presbyterian Church on March 2, 2024; a motion to approve a fundraiser for the Youth to support their summer trips to Montreat after the congregational meeting on February 11, 2024; a motion to approve the 2024 budget as presented to Session; a motion for the creation of a designated fund for the Refugee Resettlement Ministry; a motion to approve the 2024 communion schedule, including Wednesdays in which Messy Church is scheduled as part of SOW, Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and the mid-October Pride Service; a motion to add a second worship service during Lent 2024 (beginning, Sunday, February 18) 8:30-9:10 am; and a motion for Arts at Shandon to raise monetary support in the form of voluntary donations at any non-ticketed Arts at Shandon events, with a portion of the proceeds supporting one of Shandon's approved outreach ministries. The remaining proceeds will sustain Arts at Shandon.
- Building and Grounds Ministry reported that the plumbing in the area around Davis Hall and the church offices was old and in need of replacement. The ministry will start to obtain quotes for this work.
- Rev. Jenny McDevitt was scheduled to lead worship at APCE, the Association of Partners in Christian Education, during their Annual Event in St. Louis, MO, January 24-27, 2024. Rev. John Cook reported that the Circle of Welcome is supporting its new family. April Martin is preparing for Youth Sunday on March 17, 2024 at 10:30 AM.
